The MACA-CalSystem Promise

A Californians-owned, California-accountable platform to help shield Californians from the economic affordability crisis. CalSystem is proposed as a secure operating system, internet browser, software, apps, hardware, and device ecosystem designed to strengthen privacy, cybersecurity, AI safety, public accountability, jobs, manufacturing, and long-term economic value. Built first for Californians, with responsible support for sister states and the USA when legally approved. Target launch: July 4, 2028.

Who Benefits

Californians, families, students, workers, small businesses, schools, public agencies, manufacturers, homeowners, renters, patients, and sister states in the USA that want secure, human-centered technology support.

Affordability Crisis Shield Rule

CalSystem income is proposed to support California affordability goals while the platform strengthens privacy, cybersecurity, AI safety, manufacturing, healthcare affordability, insurance affordability, and responsible housing finance, subject to law, audits, and public accountability.

Simple Seven Point Plan

- 1. Californians-owned operating system. CalSystem will be a Californians-owned and California-accountable operating system designed to protect privacy, strengthen cybersecurity, support public services, and give Californians more control over their digital future.**
- 2. California browser, software, and apps.** California will build its own secure internet browser, core software, public-service apps, developer tools, and app ecosystem for government, education, business, and consumer use.
- 3. California computers, phones, hardware, and components. The CalSystem vision includes California-designed computers, phones, tablets, servers, chips, circuit boards, displays, batteries, chargers, cables, routers, security devices, accessories, and repair parts, with a strong goal to manufacture, assemble, test, repair, and refurbish qualifying equipment in California.**
- 4. No unchecked AI in California.** CalSystem will block harmful AI that threatens California jobs, weakens schooling and literacy, exploits children, replaces human judgment in sensitive decisions, or puts privacy and security at risk. Any approved AI use must be human-controlled, transparent, auditable.
- 5. Designed to beat legacy platforms on trust.** CalSystem is designed to compete with Apple, Microsoft, Google, Android, and other systems by setting a higher standard for privacy, cybersecurity, transparency, independent audits, and public accountability. MACA is for Freedom.
- 6. Made in California manufacturing, components, and small jobs. California will rebuild technology manufacturing by supporting small manufacturers, engineers, designers, component suppliers, machine shops, factories, testers, repair teams, packaging teams, logistics teams, and skilled workers so future equipment can proudly carry a Made in California identity.**
7. MACA affordability shield, public-benefit reserve, 30-day action, and USA support. The goal is to keep jobs, investment, intellectual property, tax benefits, licensing revenue, manufacturing income, platform revenue, and long-term economic value in California while placing qualifying CalSystem income into a separate MACA-CalSystem public-benefit reserve beside the regular government budget. The reserve goal is to support healthcare affordability, insurance affordability, housing finance, commercial lending support, cybersecurity, affordability-crisis relief, and sister-state support across the USA, subject to law, audits, and public accountability. California-first hiring, supplier matching, and production planning will begin within 30 days after taking office. If I don't deliver will Resign.

MACA remains the top campaign umbrella name. CalSystem and CalSystems are protected working names for the proposed Californians-owned, California-accountable, human-centered operating system, browser, software, apps, hardware, and device ecosystem. This document uses CalSystem as the general public-facing system name and identifies the platform as MACA's economic affordability crisis shield for Californians. The ecosystem is intended to serve Californians first and support sister states in the USA when legally approved, secure, and operationally ready. Final corporate, trademark, product, ownership, and legal names are subject to legal clearance, registration, and public accountability review.

California small manufacturers	CalSystems is seeking California small manufacturers, small businesses, machine shops, device makers, component suppliers, repair specialists, software teams, app builders, and cybersecurity builders to support the new ecosystem.
California-first jobs	Jobs, supplier opportunities, pilot production, training, and public benefits are intended first for Californians and California-based businesses, consistent with applicable law, security standards, procurement rules, and the MACA economic affordability shield goal.
30-day start after taking office	Upon taking office, the administration will begin onboarding qualified California workers, engineers, designers, manufacturers, and small-business partners within the first 30 days. Production planning and supplier matching will start immediately.
System ready, team standby	The CalSystem vision, design direction, and initial team are ready to move. The team is on standby to begin legal review, technical review, manufacturing planning, cybersecurity review, and California-first hiring immediately. Only California Legal to work Residents.
Made in California identity	The goal is for qualifying computers, phones, accessories, software, apps, and hardware to carry a proud Made in California identity when legally qualified and when California production standards are met. Get ready for Small Business Start, We will cap at \$475,000 Gross Revenue, \$95,000.00 Net Profit. Create 7 Jobs.
California-first, USA-supporting	This plan is for Californians first: California workers, students, families, small businesses, schools, manufacturers, homeowners, patients, and public agencies. After California deployment, CalSystem will support sister states across the USA when legally approved and technically ready.
Hardware manufacturing components	CalSystems will seek California suppliers for chips and secure elements, circuit boards, display assemblies, batteries, chargers, cables, device bodies, keyboards, cameras, biometric sensors, routers, firewalls, servers, storage devices, packaging, testing, repair, refurbishing, and logistics support.

California-born. Californians-owned. Made for California first, then ready to support sister states and the USA.

Component Area	California Manufacturing Target
Core computing parts	Processors when feasible, secure elements, motherboards, circuit boards, memory modules, power-management boards, firmware security modules, and trusted boot components.
Phones, computers, and tablets	Device bodies, keyboards, screens, touch panels, cameras, biometric sensors, speakers, microphones, hinges, cases, cooling parts, and final assembly.
Power and accessories	Batteries, chargers, adapters, cables, docking stations, protective cases, mounts, stands, repair kits, and replacement parts.
Network and security equipment	Routers, firewalls, encrypted storage devices, servers, identity devices, secure login hardware, school safety devices, and government cybersecurity equipment.
Software-ready hardware testing	California-based quality testing, security testing, privacy testing, stress testing, repair testing, refurbishing, warranty service, and certification support.
Small manufacturer pipeline	Small California manufacturers, machine shops, component suppliers, electronics assemblers, packaging teams, logistics providers, and repair specialists will be prioritized where legally allowed.
Made in California standard	Qualifying products may carry a Made in California identity only when legal, manufacturing, procurement, safety, security, and labeling standards are satisfied.

MACA-CalSystem Public Benefit Reserve & California Financial Sector Plan

California-born income. Californians-owned reserve. Economic affordability crisis shield for California first, then support for sister states and the USA.

<p>The MACA-CalSystem Public Benefit Reserve CalSystem income is proposed to be held beside the regular government funding and budget plan in a separate MACA-CalSystem public-benefit reserve. This reserve is intended to act as an economic affordability crisis shield for Californians by supporting free or lower-cost healthcare, affordable insurance, responsible housing finance, commercial lending support, cybersecurity, manufacturing, jobs, and long-term economic protection for Californians, subject to legal approval, public audits, and transparent rules.</p>	
<p>Financial Sector 1: Regular Government Budget Traditional state funding, existing programs, taxes, federal funds, infrastructure budgets, education budgets, healthcare budgets, and public-service appropriations continue under normal law and budget rules.</p>	<p>Financial Sector 2: MACA-CalSystem Public Benefit Reserve Qualifying CalSystem profits, licensing income, manufacturing income, platform revenue, security revenue, and long-term economic value are proposed to be kept in a side reserve for Californians, separate from the regular budget and controlled through public accountability as an affordability-crisis shield.</p>

Reserve Benefit Targets

Benefit Area	MACA-CalSystem Reserve Goal
Healthcare support	Use reserve income to support free healthcare programs for eligible Californians as part of the MACA affordability shield, coordinated with lawful state health programs and public accountability rules.
Affordable insurance	Use reserve income to help make approved health, home, auto, business, and other qualifying insurance more affordable for Californians through lawful underwriting, reinsurance, subsidy, or public-benefit structures. No business out of State.
Housing mortgage rate target	Create a California housing finance goal with a proposed mortgage interest-rate cap target of 4.09% or lower for qualifying Californians. This is a highest-estimate target and may go lower if lawful funding, underwriting, and market conditions allow. Forget Federal Reserve.
Commercial rate target	Create a California small-business and commercial finance goal with a proposed commercial interest-rate cap target of 4.79% or lower for qualifying California businesses. This is a highest-estimate target and may go lower if lawful funding, underwriting, and market conditions allow.
Cybersecurity and fraud protection	Fund stronger protection against hacking, identity theft, financial fraud, ransomware, and digital abuse for Californians, schools, businesses, and public agencies. Protect Californians, Americans.
California-first reserve rule	The reserve is intended for Californians first: California residents, California workers, California small businesses, California manufacturers, California schools, California patients, California families, and California public services.

CalSystem \$1,000,000 Authorized Security Challenge

<p>Break it in the authorized test zone. Protect the people. CalSystem will announce a \$1,000,000 authorized security challenge for anyone who can legally break, crack, or expose a weakness at any level of the approved test system. Students, young innovators with guardian consent where required, scientists, engineers, cybersecurity researchers, and independent builders may participate if they follow the official rules. Controlled proof-of-break inside the approved test environment is acceptable; real-world damage, data theft, service disruption, attacks on people, or misuse of private information are not acceptable. Final reward levels, age eligibility, scope, test environment, verification process, and rules will be published before testing begins.</p>
