Federal law. State accountability. Order, safety, and opportunity.

MACA policy for Californians is to respect federal authority over immigration while setting one clear statewide rule for public safety, lawful work, schools, hospitals, and county accountability.

1. State the rules clearly. MACA will affirm that immigration enforcement is a federal responsibility while California is responsible for public safety, essential services, labor standards, and order in every county.

2. Replace patchwork with one statewide standard. MACA will issue a governor-led operating framework so counties, sheriffs, schools, hospitals, and agencies follow one consistent rule instead of conflicting local practices.

3. Put violent crime, cartels, and trafficking first. MACA will direct state enforcement energy toward gangs, trafficking, organized theft, fentanyl networks, and repeat violent offenders rather than political theater.

4. Protect schools, hospitals, and courthouses. MACA will require clear warrant-based protocols, staff training, and continuity plans so children can learn, patients can seek care, and victims can access the courts.

5. End labor exploitation and wage theft. MACA will crack down on labor trafficking, underpayment, unsafe conditions, and employer abuse so honest businesses are not undercut by lawbreaking competitors.

6. Support legal work, English, and integration. MACA will strengthen English instruction, legal navigation, credential recognition, and job pathways that help lawful residents move into stable work and stronger communities.

7. Measure results and hold counties accountable. MACA will publish county-by-county scorecards on compliance, public safety, service continuity, and labor enforcement so Californians can see clear results statewide.
